SEAT RESERVATION ELIGIBILITY

The Adath Jeshurun bylaws state that reserving a High Holy Day seat is a privilege of membership. Seat reservations are available for members whose synagogue accounts are current. "Current" has been defined by the Board of Trustees as having no statement balance older than 90 days.

RECIPROCAL SEAT POLICY

AJ welcomes guests who are **out-of-town** family members of AJ congregants. As a courtesy, AJ will extend complimentary seats to these guests provided that they submit a letter from their home shul stating that High Holy Day seats are included in their membership support, or that the individuals have purchased High Holy Day seats this year. If seat reservations are not included in their membership support, or if the individuals have not purchased High Holy Day seat reservations this year at their home shul, payment for seat reservations must be submitted with the AJ Seat Reservation Form.

Out-of-town family members who receive reciprocal seats are assigned seats **only for the services they will be attending**. AJ will be assigning those same seats to others when not in use by the reciprocal seat occupant.

GENERAL INFORMATION

For security purposes, the Preschool entrance doors will be locked. The Preschool may be entered using one of the main floor stairwells. Children attending Childcare will have light snacks and a dairy lunch when applicable. Visiting during Childcare is not allowed by adults, nor by children who are not enrolled in Childcare. ALL children must be picked up PROMPTLY following the conclusion of services by a parent or guardian. Infants must be at least six weeks old. Parents of infants must bring bottles and diapers, labeled with the infant's name.
