SEAT RESERVATION ELIGIBILITY

The AJ bylaws state that reserving a High Holy Day Seat is a privilege of membership. Seat reservations are available for members whose AJ accounts are current (having no statement balance older than 90 days). Complimentary seats are available for those receiving reciprocal seats (see box to the right), those in the military, non-local college students, and non-members who have not previously received complimentary seats. Membership is required for all other seat reservations. Please contact Belinda Lasch at 458-5359 for all information on seat reservations and/or obtaining a membership at AJ.

RECIPROCAL SEAT POLICY FOR NON-LOCALS

AJ welcomes guests who are **out-of-town** family members of AJ congregants. As a courtesy, AJ will extend complimentary seats to these guests provided that they submit a letter from their home shul stating that High Holy Day seats are included in their membership support, or that the individuals have purchased High Holy Day seats this year. If seat reservations are not included in their membership support, or if the individuals have not purchased High Holy Day seat reservations this year at their home shul, payment for seat reservations must be submitted with the AJ Seat Reservation Form. Names of all reciprocal guests must be included on the seat form.

GENERAL INFORMATION

For security purposes, the Preschool entrance doors are locked on the High Holy Days. The Preschool may be entered using the main floor stairwell across from the Coat Room. Children attending Childcare will receive light snacks and a dairy lunch when applicable. Visiting during Childcare by adults is not permitted, nor is visiting by children who are not enrolled in Childcare. ALL children must be picked up PROMPTLY following the conclusion of services by a parent or guardian. Infants must be at least six weeks old. Parents of infants must bring bottles, baby food, and diapers, labeled with the infant's name.

RESERVATIONS ARE REQUIRED! Childcare for infants through Grade 2 is offered for the duration of the services. Childcare for children in grades 3 through 5 is offered before and after Jr. Congregation. Structured High Holy Day activities are provided during Childcare and are listed on the enclosed Childcare Reservation Form. Children will also be brought up to the sanctuary to hear the blowing of the shofar. **The Reservation Deadline is TUESDAY, AUGUST 20th.**
